

WHAT WE'RE WATCHING

Today, Syria will hold presidential elections pitting Bashar Al-Assad against two relatively unknown candidates, with an outcome that is all but assured. Voting will only be allowed for Syrians living in regime-controlled areas, and many tribes have vowed to boycott the sham election.

The actual intention behind the rigged vote, however, may be to create the appearance of democratic legitimacy so that Gulf Arab states and others can more comfortably reengage in dialogue with the dictator and, ultimately, invest in the rebuilding of the country following ten years of devastating war.

Global

Globally, confirmed coronavirus cases surpassed 167.8 million with 3.4 million deaths.

 Japanese newspaper publisher Asahi Shimbun, an official partner of the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, called for the games to be cancelled in an editorial on Wednesday, citing coronavirus risks to public safety and strains on the medical system.



Global

Globally, over the past week, the number of new cases and deaths reported continued to decrease, with over 4.1 million new cases and 84 000 new deaths reported.

The European Region reported the largest decline in new cases and deaths this week, followed by the South-East Asia Region.

The Region of the Americas, Eastern Mediterranean, African, and Western Pacific Regions reported similar numbers of cases to the previous week.

COVID-19 Vaccine

Pfizer plans to apply for emergency use authorization in the US in September for use of its COVID-19 vaccine in kids aged 2-11.

- A new CDC report found that "*breakthrough*"
 COVID-19 cases are relatively rare, with a total of 10,262 individuals testing positive for the virus after being fully vaccinated between January and April.

Markets & Business

A new report published by ISS Corporate Solutions found that the number of S&P 500 companies appointing black board members has jumped since in the year since George Floyd's murder.

- US Federal Reserve Vice Chairman Clarida became the latest official to say the central bank may soon discuss reducing **asset purchases**.
- **United** predicted it will be profitable in Q3 as summer domestic travel boosts flight prices.
- Auto insurer **Geico** will begin using AI to process policyholders vehicle repair needs.

- Morgan Stanley's global head of prime brokerage Ed Keller is stepping down, after the division triggered a \$911 million hit to firm profits through dealing with Archegos Capital.
- Washington DC sued **Amazon** for allegedly violating the district's competition laws through its pricing for merchants.
- The European Commission is set to open a formal probe into Facebook's alleged anti-competitive practices.

Africa

- Powerful aftershocks from the eruption of the Sunday eruption of the Mount Nyiragongo volcano in the Democratic Republic of the Congo opened new fissures in the ground and drove further displacement.
- Mozambican President Nyusi called an extraordinary summit of the South African Development Community to request the group's assistance in fighting the insurgency in Cabo Delgado.
- Ethiopian and Eritrean soldiers forcibly detained some 400 people from a camp for displaced people near Tigray.
- **Malian** interim vice president Colonel Assimi Goita, who led the coup in August, announced that he had seized power a day after detaining the interim president and prime minister, saying that they had failed to consult him about a recent government reshuffle that removed several military figures from the cabinet.

Asia

- Total births in Japan fell 4.7 percent in the year ending in March, in evidence that the pandemic will worsen the country's demographic crunch.
- Hackers who targeted hospitals in New Zealand's Waikato district have released what appears to be private patient information to media outlets, as health systems struggled to come back online more than a week after the attack.
- Thai law-enforcement officials are considering early parole as a measure to curb prison outbreaks of COVID-19.
- **China** is bracing for a heavy flood season with 71 rivers already exceeding warning levels, as meteorological authorities warned that global warming is fueling more extreme weather.
- Chinese foreign minister Wang Yi criticized the EU for freezing the Comprehensive Investment Agreement (CAI) and linking the deal to human rights concerns.

Europe

- At a Tuesday summits in Brussels, Poland's prime minister led opposition to upcoming plans to extend Europe's carbon price, arguing that it will impact poorer countries the most.
- The Siberian province of Yakutia will make COVID-19 vaccines mandatory for some workers as Russian officials warn that nationwide uptake is too slow. Austria is banning flights from the UK due to the prevalence of the Indian variant there. Romania surpassed 30,000 deaths.
- Opposition groups in Belarus are pressing the EU to sanction state-owned oil and petrochemical companies over the detention of journalist Roman Protasevich. Russia dismissed allegations of involvement in the diversion of Protasevich's flight as "obsessive Russiaphobia." French President Macron called for the Belarusian opposition to join the upcoming Group of 7 meeting; host UK said there were no plans.
- Azerbaijan accused Armenian forces of firing at its troops across the two countries' international border on May 24-26. Relations between the two countries remain strained after Azeri troops last year drove ethnic Armenian forces out of territory they had controlled since the 1990s in and around the Nagorno-Karabakh region.

Middle East

- **Oman's** Sultan Haitham ordered a new jobs initiative that would employ 2,000 in the wake of rare protests over unemployment in the country.
- **Russia** announced that it is training **Saudi** cosmonauts for a joint manned space mission.
- **Syrians** vote today in an election in which President Bashar al Assad's victory is considered pre-determined.
- US Secretary of State Blinken announced that the US would reopen its Jerusalem consulate to reestablish ties with the Palestinian Authority, and increase development aid to Palestinian territories, in a visit to Ramallah in the West Bank.
- The head of the IAEA has warned that **Iran** is enriching uranium at purity levels that "*only countries making bombs are reaching*". Iran officially approved seven candidates for its upcoming elections, but barred several popular prospective candidates, including former president Ahmadinejad.

Americas

- **Costa Rica** became the 38th member of the OECD after 11 years of efforts to join the club of developed nations. **Chile, Colombia and Mexico** are the other Latin American OECD members, while **Argentina, Brazil and Peru** are under consideration.
- The **US** Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) downgraded **Mexico's** air-safety rating in a blow to the country's travel industry.
- The **Colombian** government and the strike committee reached a "*pre-agreement*" to restart work and improve conditions in talks.
- **Peru's** Shining Path rebels killed 16 in an apparent move to discourage voting in the June 6 election.





Americas: US

- Across the nation, 164.4 million people have received at least one dose of vaccine, or 49.5 percent to the total population. Half of US adults have now been fully vaccinated; the share of fully vaccinated residents is significantly divergent across different states, ranging between Vermont at over 64 percent vaccinated to Mississippi at only 34 percent.
- Sales of **newly built homes** in the US fell more than expected in April as high prices and limited supply are beginning to decelerate the market.
- Federal and state officials are working to develop two **wind farm sites** off the coast of California, which could power about 1.6 million homes.
- A group of Republicans are preparing a \$1 trillion counteroffer to President Biden's infrastructure plan. House Republican leaders denounced Representative Greene (R-GA) for comparing mask mandates and proof of vaccines to the holocaust.
- President Biden will hold a summit with Russian President Putin on June 16 in Geneva in an
 effort to "restore predictability and stability" to the US-Russia relationship. President Biden said
 he decided to waive sanctions against the company behind the Nord Stream 2 gas pipeline
 because the project was nearly complete and doing so could have harmed ties with Europe.



Emerging and Existing Hotspots: Jihadist Movements in Africa Ascendant in 2021

Mostly lost among international headlines through the first five months of 2021 are increasing jihadist attacks and intensifying Islamist insurgencies across Africa. The threat is, of course, nothing new to Africa, nor are the underlying conditions that allow it to persist. What is new, however, is that Islamic State and Al-Qaeda affiliated groups are currently ascendant from the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean.

This comes as Western governments dedicate fewer resources to counter-terror operations amid a shift to great power competition. On the continent, the consequences of ignoring the persistent and growing threat posed by various jihadists groups will be more devastation and displacement as well as a loss of willingness by outside investors to risk money in unstable areas. For the international community, although Islamist terrorists based in Africa have not yet struck significant targets beyond the continent, they may opt to do so in the future as they compete with rivals for funding, followers and prestige.

North Africa and Sahel Region

Ten years after the start of the Libyan civil war, North Africa and the Sahel region are home to more jihadists than ever in modern times.

An influx of fighters arrived there after the 2019 collapse of the Islamic State Caliphate in Syria and Iraq, and some have even relocated from faraway places such as Afghanistan. As a result, some 50 global and Sahel-based NGOs wrote an open letter in April 2021 calling for a fresh approach to fighting jihadism, arguing that international counter-terrorism coalitions are not solving the root causes that allow them to live in the vast desert and attract new recruits from local tribes.

Primarily, the letter called for dialogue with militants and fair and impartial trials. In a place like Mali, the center of the anti-jihadist fight, this will be more difficult in the wake of the country's second coup d'etat in nine months. This latest instability comes as Islamist insurgents control more and more of Mali's countryside and follows the kidnapping of French journalist Oliver Dubois in April by al-

Qaeda affiliate Jama'at Nusrat Al-Islam wa'l-Muslimin (JNIM) . Meanwhile, French security officials have warned that international attacks could emanate from the country. To the east, Burkina Faso witnessed one of the worst jihadist attacks in the country's history this month with dozens of civilians killed, while security forces there are increasingly ambushed and killed in counter-terror operations. The situation is not much better further to the west in Niger and Chad, where the former president was killed on the frontlines while battling Libya-based jihadists. This is not to mention long running insurgencies in Algeria and Mauritania as well as fighting between al-Qaeda in the Maghreb (AQIM) and Islamic State affiliates over which radical ideology is supreme.

West Africa

Islamist terrorism is now the most serious issue facing West African countries, according to a recent statement from Ghana's president. This follows reports that jihadists from the Sahel are starting to enter border areas of Ivory Coast and Benin, while France has opened the door to pulling some troops out of the region. Some West African nations are just now confronting the threat, but the continent's most populous country, Nigeria, has fought Boko Haram jihadists for over a decade, a group that has killed several tens of thousands of soldiers in combat and civilians in terror attacks. Thus far in 2021, the violent extremists captured a Nigerian military base for the first time in several years and forced almost 100,000 more villagers to flee their homes in the country's Muslim north. The situation is more complicated than ever as Boko Haram also battles rival Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWP) jihadists, which reportedly surrounded Boko's leader in a jungle in a recent skirmish leading him to attempt to kill himself to avoid capture. It is still unclear if he is alive or dead. ISWP also regularly attacks Nigerian security forces. The threat is transnational, and Cameroonian military forces regularly confront Boko Haram and other jihadists that attempt to cross the border into their country to hide out or kidnap locals for ransom .

East Africa

Across the continent in East Africa is another of the longest running Islamist insurgencies. Somalia's Qaeda affiliated al-Shabaab group remains one of the most persistent and dangerous jihadist movements on the continent and continues to threaten the government, civilians, maritime shipping, neighbors and more. US forces withdrew from Somalia in January 2021 following an order from former US President Trump. During the withdrawal, al-Shabaab killed three US Department of Defense personnel. More recently, the

group kidnapped seven Kenyan soldiers in an ambush, and hashas vowed future attacks on Kenya because the country has sent troops to support Mogadishu's counter-terror operations over the years. Bordering both Kenya and Somalia is Ethiopia's Ogadin province, which is inhabited by 6 to 7 million Muslims. Ethiopia's intelligence services routinely report the arrest of militants in the region linked to either al Qaeda affiliates, al Shabaab or the Islamic State.

Southeast Africa

One of the newest battlegrounds for jihadists on the continent is Southeast Africa. Mozambique is among those worst hit as fighters under the banner of Islamic State Central Africa Province (ISCAP) have launched so many attacks in 2021 that France's Total declared "force majeure" on a major energy project. Since then, 800,000 Mozambicans have fled from their homes due to fighting. Portugal sent a small contingent of military trainers as part of a five-year deal to provide advice on how to push back the armed zealots, but they have established a strong presence now in the oil and gas-rich north of the country. Further to the north, Congolese military forces are regularly battling Islamic State affiliates in the jungles along the border between Democratic Republic of Congo and Uganda.

The Outlook


It is important to remember that the vast majority of jihadist fighters in Africa are homegrown locals who operate under the names of well-known international groups like Islamic State and Al-Qaeda because of the intimidation factor and prestige it bestows. While some are die hard ideologues, many are likely disillusioned youth with few economic opportunities disillusioned by the rampant corruption and government ineffectiveness that plagues their countries. Two decades of counter-terror operations in the Middle East and South Asia have proven that military and police measures must be coupled with economic growth and political stability to make a lasting impact. With the threat of violent jihadists spreading across the continent, many countries are in the unfortunate position of having to dedicate precious resources to guick-fix military solutions rather than long-term public investments that could stem extremism in the future. As a result, Africa may soon be considered the most active battlefield for violent Islamist extremists in the world.

As of 2100 hours US EDT on May 25, 2021




Confirmed Cases (New)




